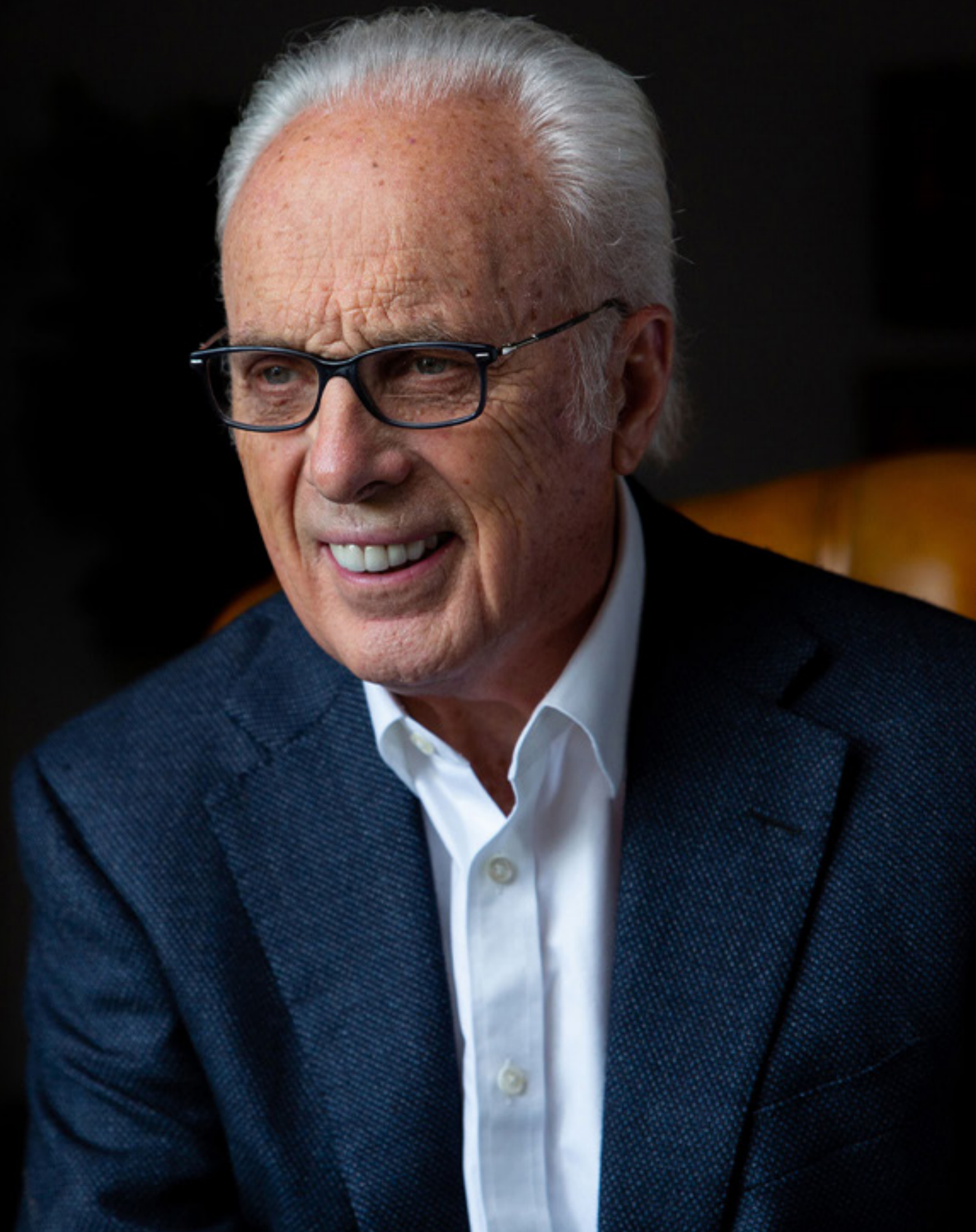

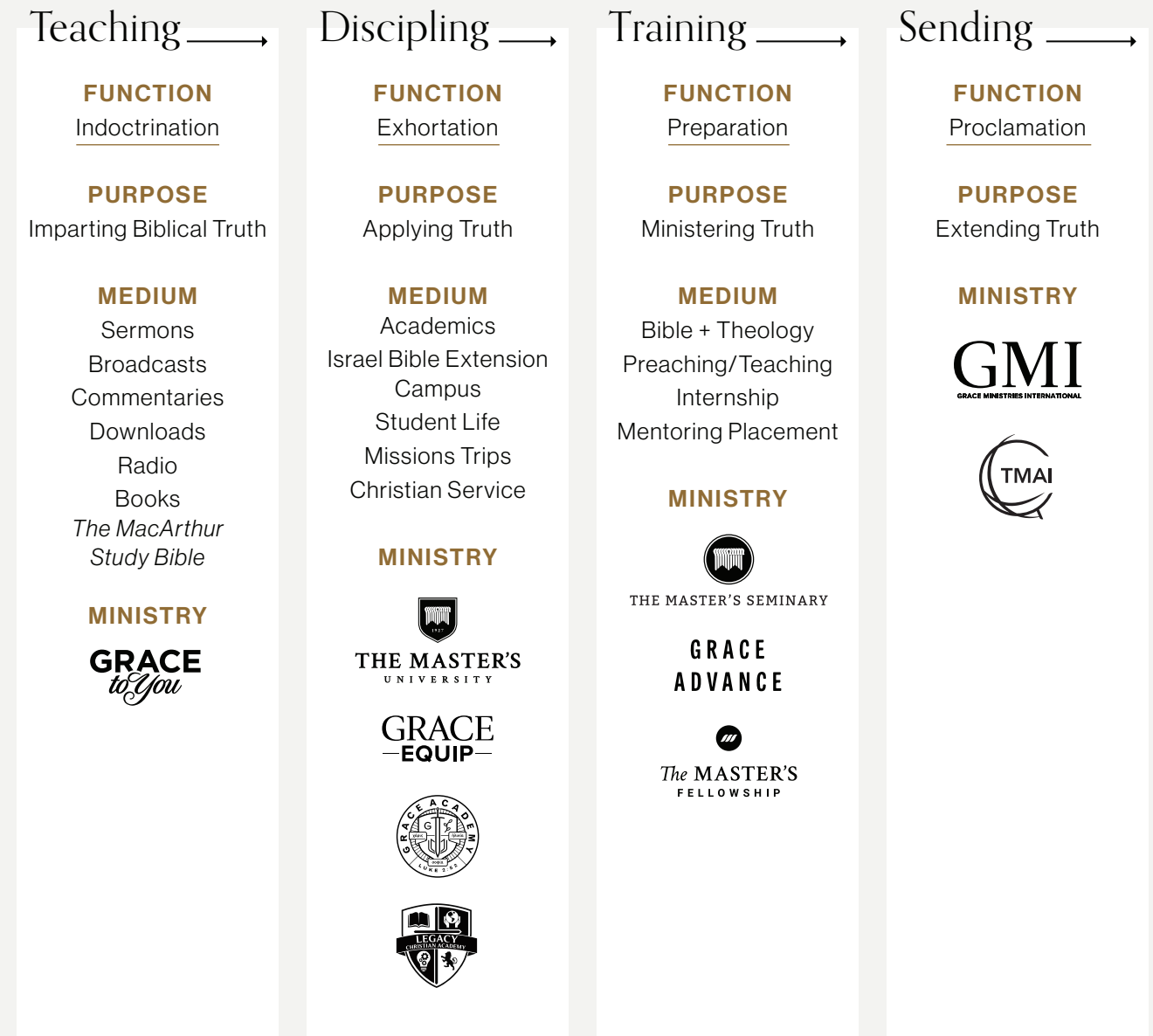

TMS currently has 750 students enrolled with over 2,000 alumni serving in 50-plus countries worldwide.

2022 Investments

THE MACARTHUR CENTER FOR EXPOSITORY PREACHING

Season 2 - *The Entrusted* was released and supported by the MacArthur Trust. This season explores the stories of the men who entrusted the gospel to John MacArthur and how he has entrusted his ministry to faithful men who will carry on the Lord's work for generations to come.

THE MACARTHUR TRUST SCHOLARSHIP

The MacArthur Trust Scholarship is a full-tuition scholarship that removes the primary financial hurdle keeping men from premier theological training at The Master's Seminary. This is the most significant, and widely available, full-time scholarship offered by TMS. Dozens of men have been awarded the MacArthur Trust Scholarship which allowed them to enroll at TMS, and in the future, the profound effects of this scholarship will be reflected in the ministries of the graduates of TMS.

TMAI PARTNERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

In partnership with The Master's Academy International, The Master's Seminary offers scholarships to select students connected with TMAI. The scholarship has been established specifically for graduates, future instructors, and current TMAI faculty and staff.

TMS ALUMNI PARTNERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

A scholarship intended to aid long distance students enrolled at TMS who are members of churches pastored by TMS alumni, with the anticipation of strengthening those churches for generations to come.

INSTITUTE FOR THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

The Institute for the Christian Life is a series of online courses providing advanced doctrinal, biblical, and practical training for church leaders and any committed student of God's Word.

In 2022, the MacArthur Trust invested in the development of a new course by Dr. Brad Klassen, professor of Bible Exposition at The Master's Seminary. The course is titled "How to Study Your Bible." This 10-week course is designed to help laypeople study the Word of God accurately. The Trust's investment also helped with marketing efforts that resulted in the highest volume of classes taken in the history of ICL.

HABIB TANNOUS (ANAHEIM, CA)

Without the MacArthur Trust Scholarship, I could not have attended The Master's Seminary. In 2020 my industry – post-production for TV shows and movies – halted because of COVID-19. As I reevaluated my career during that time, I realized that it would be far better to devote my life to the eternal work of serving the Lord Jesus Christ than movies and TV shows which will one day be forgotten. A Providential Path

HOW THE MACARTHUR TRUST SCHOLARSHIP BROUGHT ADAM WILSON TO THE MASTER'S SEMINARY

When Adam Wilson expresses amazement at the journey that brought him from Cedar Falls, Iowa, to Los Angeles and The Master's Seminary, he isn't using the word "journey" as a metaphor. He is actually talking about his trip across the country the first week of August 2022. That's when Adam wrapped up a summer of ministry at a camp in Missouri and immediately began the drive to California. In Colorado, Adam's car started rattling and he sensed he was losing control. He managed to steer the failing car through heavy traffic until he was off the highway. A few yards from the exit ramp, Adam discovered that his brake caliper had fallen off. If he had stayed in traffic a minute longer, he would have been stuck on a fast-moving highway with no brakes.

"[My father and I] took the car to a nearby dealership where a mechanic tells us we're lucky to be alive," Adam says. "During a recent service appointment, someone had failed to tighten the bolts on our brakes."



Because of the delay in Colorado, Adam did not arrive in Southern California until 4 a.m. the first day of orientation at The Master's Seminary. After a quick nap, he began to meet his new classmates, professors, and staff. Despite the physical exhaustion, Adam was energized.

"I knew right away that this was the place I was supposed to be," Adam says. "I immediately met some awesome people and was so thankful that this was where I was going to train for ministry."

Protection through a mechanical failure was added to an already

long list of God's providences that have made it clear that The Master's Seminary is where Adam is supposed to be. Adam grew up in a Christian home. His father served as a lay elder at their church in Cedar Falls, Iowa. The Lord saved Adam when he was 9 years old, using the preaching at a summer camp to convict him of his need for God's righteousness. After high school, Adam attended the University of Northern Iowa, intending to pursue a career in law enforcement. But as he became more and more involved with youth ministry at his church and the summer camp where he was saved (and was ministering the summer

before enrolling at TMS), his desire for ministry began to outpace his interest in any other career. By his college graduation, Adam knew he needed seminary. But he wasn't sure where. And he wasn't sure there was still an opportunity to begin school that coming fall.

“I narrowed it down to two seminaries, TMS being one of them,” Adam says. “And as I was looking at the other seminary, I began to sense that their statement of faith didn't match what they were teaching. When I also saw the outcome of some students, I was confused, not sure what was going on there. So I called The Master's Seminary in May, a little more than two months before the start of the new school year. I didn't think there was any chance I could still apply and be accepted for the fall semester. But the counselor I spoke

to encouraged me to apply. I also flew out to Los Angeles to visit the campus. That's when I knew for sure that TMS was where I should be.”

Adam's application was accepted in time, which was a wonderful surprise, but then he had to figure out how to afford seminary and the move to expensive Southern California.

“On a whim, I put my name in for the MacArthur Trust Scholarship, not expecting anything to happen,” Adam says. “But in June, I got an email saying I had received the scholarship. I couldn't believe it. I was so thankful.”

Adam is one of dozens of students who weren't sure they could afford to attend The Master's Seminary without the MacArthur Trust Scholarship. It has opened doors

for godly young men like Adam to receive theological training on the campus of Grace Community Church.

“I'm thankful to be here in the classroom with all the professors. Getting to know them, meeting with them, learning from them has been great,” Adam says. He's also involved in college ministry at Grace Community Church. He knows that as invaluable as the classroom time is, his education at TMS wouldn't be complete without training in the church. “Getting to know Austin [Duncan] in Crossroads and having a great community has definitely been one of the highlights. Through it all, seminary has shown me that I need more discipline and I also need to balance work, ministry, and life as I prepare to serve in whatever capacity the Lord has for me after seminary.”



THE MACARTHUR CENTER PODCAST

Mobilizing a Generation of Preachers through Education, Modeling, and Mentorship in the Art of Expository Preaching.

The Center's primary means of educating these preachers has come through the MacArthur Center Podcast. In its first two seasons, the Center's podcast has amassed a large following (total listens recently topped one million) and is proving to be a valuable recruitment tool for the seminary.

The podcast is listened to in more than 100 countries and has been rated as high as the 16th most popular Christian show on Apple Podcasts in the United States.

The Master's Academy International has 18 member schools across 18 countries, all training the next generation of leaders for the global church. To date, there are 2,158 current students and 7,182 graduates at these member schools.

As this ministry grows rapidly, so do the needs. In 2022, the John MacArthur Trust approved over **\$4,000,000** in grants to The Master's Academy International.

2022 Investments

CURRENT MEMBER SCHOOL EXPANSION

Each of TMAI's 18 member schools is expanding its ability to train men for the work of pastoral ministry. The MacArthur Trust aided a number of these schools with scholarships for students and funds for establishing new degree programs.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE:

- **Spain:** Remodel and add-on to existing conference and training center; Extension into Portugal.
- **India:** Purchase of apartment building for student housing.
- **Philippines:** Cross-border extension into Pakistan.

MACARTHUR MINISTRY JOINT PROJECTS

Because of the Trust's 2022 investment, TMAI is pursuing a number of exciting joint projects with several of the MacArthur Trust family of ministries.

- **Translation** of TMU's Master of Arts, Biblical Studies (MABC) into Vietnamese.
- **TMUS-TMAI Partnership Scholarship** to make University and Seminary education accessible.
- Shared educational platforms.
- Access to TMUS electronic library resources for all TMAI locations.

TRANSLATION AND GLOBAL PUBLICATIONS

TMAI's Global Publications department facilitates the translation and publishing of sound theological resources into many languages around the world for our current and future training centers.

CURRENT TRANSLATION OPPORTUNITIES INCLUDE:

- MacArthur Study Bible into Hindi, Telegu, and Marathi
- A German Bible translation

TECHNOLOGY ENHANCEMENT

Several TMAI member schools need to upgrade their technology so they can more effectively reach nonbelievers in their countries and pass truth to the next generation. In 2022, the John MacArthur Trust provided resources so that these 18 schools can provide digital campuses, increased distance offerings, and digital resources.

DEVELOPMENT OF FUTURE FIELDS

TMS graduates in 27 countries have expressed interest in partnering with TMAI for pastoral training. Two institutions, **in Myanmar and Colombia**, will likely become member schools in 2023. Additional training centers are in the process of starting in **Madagascar, Uganda, and Romania**. Resources from the John MacArthur Trust are helping ensure these new schools are well-established, well-trained theologically, and well-prepared to be effective in equipping men for gospel ministry.



Gospel Hope in War-Torn Ukraine

In late February of 2022, the Alvords and the Whites, missionary families working with The Master's Academy International, faced perhaps the most difficult decision of their lives. Should they stay in Ukraine as Russia invaded or should they come back to America until the fighting passed? The couples decided to stay in the country where they have trained pastors for nearly 30 years.

In the days following that decision, the bombing became so intense around Kyiv, the nation's capital, that the Alvords had to leave their apartment and live at the church where Bruce pastors and trains men for ministry. For a time, the Alvords, along with dozens of church families and several nonbelievers from the neighborhood, slept in an underground parking garage across the street. The garage provided several concrete layers of protection against the Russian bombs, which, at the time, were a daily presence throughout Kyiv. From the church and parking structure, the Alvords

ministered to their local congregation and kept in touch with many of the more than 900 graduates of Grace Bible Seminary, men scattered across Ukraine, engaged in the same gospel ministry as the Alvords. Not far away, the Whites ministered directly to the Ukraine army, bringing food to the soldiers, even as they provided resources, counseling, and hospitality to believers and neighbors.

Both couples were putting their lives at risk for the sake of the gospel. At times, they weren't sure they would survive the war. But because of their heroic decision to stay, the Alvords and Whites were able to minister to the body of Christ and bring the hope of the gospel to many of their neighbors. And as they heard about spiritual and humanitarian needs, they passed those stories along to their sending church, Grace Community, and their pastor, John MacArthur. In response, the church and the John MacArthur Trust stepped in to provide financial

resources, including humanitarian aid, gospel literature, and basic necessities to churches throughout the war-torn country. **The Trust's investment in the winter of 2022 was immediately used to buy food and supplies for families in dire situations.** Here is one example Bruce Alvord shared in a recent newsletter:

"It has felt like a sacred duty to dispense your gifts where the Lord (and you) would want them to go. We recently were able to underwrite the fuel costs for three vans to travel almost to the Russian border (an eight-hour, one-way trip). They were the first volunteers allowed into this very dangerous situation - a Ukrainian town newly freed from Russian occupation. They were only let in because one of the drivers had an army officer friend stationed there. These vans were loaded with food, clothes, medicine and Christian literature (also partly financed from

your gifts), and (the supplies were) passed out at a Protestant church by people we know. The residents in the newly-freed town were in bad shape, lacking basic necessities. The volunteers who delivered the help consider street evangelism as big a priority as handing out the aid. Deliveries of food, water and medicine had not gotten through to this city for a long time. Because of your gifts, we have been able to financially support teams of Christians we personally know to deliver basic necessities and ultimate hope."

That support from the John MacArthur Trust was not the first time the Trust has partnered with the gospel ministry happening in Ukraine. Since 2019, the Trust has provided \$475,000 in grants to the work of training Ukrainian pastors, particularly at Grace Bible Seminary. This has provided scholarships, facility upgrades, and much more, so that men can receive training before they begin the work of the ministry. The fruit of this investment was clearly seen throughout 2022. In the middle of the war, men from across Ukraine still came to Kyiv for training. This past October, 48 men graduated from the seminary, equipped for gospel ministry. The value of the trust's investment is seen in those men. It's also seen in the hundreds of graduates of Grace Bible Seminary who stayed with their church and cared for their people in the thick of a dangerous war.

"People in crisis ask eternal questions," says Mark Tatlock, president of The Master's Academy International. "The people with the biblical answers to those questions have to be present in the moment of crisis to answer those questions. That's exactly what is happening all over Ukraine. Yes, the leaders of these churches are meeting physical needs. But more importantly, they are meeting spiritual needs. Right now, the Alvords, Whites, and hundreds of men they've trained are engaged in biblical counseling and crisis counseling. They're also developing resources that can be used to bring hope and gospel truth to those who have suffered so much because of this war."

The kind of present and future ministry Mark describes characterizes the graduates of Grace Bible Seminary because that school is marked by a deep, uncompromising commitment to God's truth. The truth, understood and lived out, has transformed these men and, through them, is transforming countless lives throughout Ukraine. In the thick of this war, the value of theological training has become even more clear. The Trust's investment in that training will continue to pay dividends for years to come.

"If you look at a map of Ukraine, particularly the eastern front, and identify the towns or villages that are being shelled and attacked, the places you hear about on the evening news, you are also going to find a pastor or church leader that was trained by Grace Bible Seminary or another training center connected to TMAI," Mark Tatlock says. "And when war came to those towns, the pastors stayed. So in the middle of these places where there are atrocities happening every day, we have graduates faithfully serving those communities' physical and spiritual needs. The hope they are providing isn't going to be a headline on the evening news, but it's the most important work being done there, and it's certainly a headline in God's kingdom."

The Master's University (TMU) exists to empower students for a life of enduring commitment to Christ, biblical fidelity, moral integrity, intellectual growth, and lasting contribution to the kingdom of God worldwide. TMU has 19 majors with over 150 emphases (undergraduate, graduate, and online) and more than 1,100 on-campus undergraduate students and 12,000 alumni.

2022 Investments

THE MASTER'S GLOBAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Master's Global Scholarship is designed to provide financial assistance to deserving students showing reasonable progress toward the completion of a degree at The Master's University.

THE SCHOLARSHIP IS DESIGNED TO AID:

- International students with a proven affiliation to TMU through GMI, TMAI, GTY, TMS, or TMS alumni.
- Students originating from churches with long-standing relationships with TMUS, especially churches led by pastors from TMS, members of The Master's Fellowship, or the TMUS board.
- Students who are children of TMU and TMS alumni.

STUDENT HOUSING

Creating additional on-campus housing for the expansion of the student body. The MacArthur Trust has assisted TMU in the acquisition of several homes surrounding the campus in Newhall, California. This demonstrates TMU's commitment to on-campus discipleship by finding solutions to keep students on-campus, and establishes a financially advantageous way to accommodate the growth of TMU.

The MacArthur Trust has been instrumental in launching several academic programs at TMU by providing the funding for faculty, facilities, and scholarship aid necessary to make their launch successful.

The Master's Global Scholarship is Making an Impact

HERE ARE THREE STORIES OF STUDENTS BLESSED BY THE GENEROSITY OF THE MACARTHUR TRUST.

Growing up in Northridge, California, **Onalee Miller** thought she wanted to be a lawyer. Then, during high school, an entirely different world was opened to her.

"I visited a Christian nonprofit that tutors homeless kids," Miller says. "These kids were obviously very behind in their education — there were juniors who were reading at a third-grade level. It was intense. But it led to me figuring out that I love working with kids, and I want to be that kind of extra support for people whose families aren't there for them."

Since then, Miller has had her heart set on working with kids in her future career. But where would she go to prepare? As she

looked at various Christian colleges, she wasn't always impressed by their approaches to Scripture. TMU, though, was different. The only question was whether she could afford it.

"It seemed kind of out of reach for me. It looked like such an awesome school, but I just wasn't sure it was going to work out."

She says she "fell in love" with the University after she came on a tour, and she began praying that the Lord would make a way for her to come.

Almost immediately, people she knew at Grace Community Church encouraged her to apply for scholarships at TMU. One that she applied for, and received, was The Master's

Global Scholarship. Between that and other financial aid opportunities, her prayers were answered.

This fall, Miller arrived at TMU to major in liberal studies, with an emphasis in teacher education. In the long run, she is considering becoming a teacher or pivoting to speech pathology or social work. But in the meantime, she's relishing her time at TMU.

"I've been in public school all my life, so I've been super thankful to get to be in classes that open with prayer, and to have friends around me who are like-minded," Miller says. "And I've really appreciated the depth of thought that's encouraged here. My professors all encourage me to think, and then think some more, and then to think about my thinking. It's really helped me to not be complacent with where I'm at, but to really push myself."

Cedar Collins ran on a top-performing cross country team at his high school in Colorado Springs, Colorado. But for most of his running career, his heart was not in the right place.

"I was running for myself," Collins says. "I was running for my own honor. And it wasn't going well."

Then, about a year ago, things changed.

"I really woke up to sin in my

life. God also started giving me a desire to run for the Lord's glory. And once that happened, things just started falling into place. Everything changed in my life."

Soon after, through one of his teammates, Collins heard about TMU.

"I had been looking for a Christian college where I could run. I talked to a bunch of coaches, but I just saw how secular all of their teams were. It was not at all appealing to me. And as I was walking through that and praying about it, one day the Lord answered my prayers when I found out about TMU."

He looked at the University's website and was "blown away" by TMU's commitment to Scripture. Collins was thrilled about the idea of being a student here. "I remember running around my house, just being so excited. I reached out to Coach (Zach Schroeder), and he emailed me back four minutes later asking me when I could fly out."

Collins came out to California to visit, met the team, and instantly felt at home. It seemed like the perfect opportunity. There was only one barrier: finances. As the son of a single mother who worked as a schoolteacher, money was tight. But Schroeder helped connect Collins with

financial aid opportunities, including The Master's Global Scholarship, which has allowed him to attend.

Collins says that this first semester at TMU has been a wonderful experience. He's been in the process of figuring out his passions and committing to a major, as well as bonding with his new team.

"The experience has been absolutely amazing," Collins says. "Being on the team these past months has been one of the most life-changing things. Coach Schroeder always starts off our day by connecting the Bible with what we're doing as runners. He shows us

how to run as champions for Christ. And that same mindset really carries over to everything that we do in our lives."

Sofia Omelchenko never had ambitions to study in America. She grew up in Ukraine, attended a solid church, and had her eyes set on an undergraduate degree in Spanish from an institution in her home country.

But then, during her sophomore year in college, the war with Russia began.

"When the war started in Ukraine, we stopped our education," Omelchenko says. "Then they tried to do

it as distance learning — but it was still hard, because we would hear explosions and air sirens every single day. So it was hard to concentrate.”

Eventually, her parents decided it would be best to send her out of the country. Omelchenko moved in with her sister in South Carolina. Through her father, Sergei, a translator for Slavic Gospel Association, she connected with TMU and qualified for The Master's Global Scholarship. This allowed her to continue her college education while stateside, with Omelchenko moving onto campus this fall for the One-Year Bible Program. “I love it here so far,” Omelchenko says. “I didn't even expect to like it so

much, because studying abroad was never a goal I had for my life. So once it was offered, it took me a while to make a decision. But I'm so happy that I'm here, and I'm so thankful for everything that happens here.”

She has especially loved chapel and her theology class with Dr. Greg Gifford. As she takes this year to complete the Bible program, she intends to explore her options and determine her next steps toward finishing an undergraduate degree.

The Advancement of The Master's University

The Master's University recently welcomed another record-setting class of incoming students to its Newhall, California, campus.

In all, 443 new students enrolled at TMU for the fall 2022 semester. The incoming class pushed TMU's overall on-campus population to 1,146. This represents a 32% increase from the school's enrollment in 2018, with net increases to nearly every major the school offers.

This year's incoming class included students from 33 states and 24 countries. Overall, TMU's on-campus population now features students from 42 states and more than 30 countries. Including record support from generous donors, TMU students received nearly \$16 million in institutional aid this year, with 99% of students receiving some form of financial assistance.

In 2022, TMU added degrees in mechanical engineering, computer engineering, electrical engineering, sport management, interdisciplinary studies, and entrepreneurial studies. In previous years, the school also added marketing media and classical liberal arts. Overall, TMU offers more than 150 undergraduate, graduate, online, and dual enrollment programs.

TMU owes the new degrees above to the kindness of the Lord through the faithful support

of the MacArthur Trust, which partners with its family of ministries to invest in areas that produce a substantial return on investment. The funding from the MacArthur Trust to TMU has propelled the institution forward in a way unimaginable prior to the funding.

Not only has the Trust played an integral role in starting the new degree programs, it provided funding to hire faculty, scholarship aid to recruit students, equipment necessary for learning, and capital to bolster the facilities that house the programs.

Potentially the most important of all the MacArthur Trust's investments in TMU has been made in student housing. To accommodate the growing demand for on-campus education, and to do so in a financially savvy way, the Trust helped TMU buy more than a dozen homes in Placerita Canyon, the neighborhood where The Master's University campus is situated. The ownership of these homes — which total over \$20,000,000 in value — has put the University in a position of strength.

Students have been living in these homes starting in the Fall 2022 semester. Approximately 150 were able to experience on-campus education because of the proximity of these homes to The Master's University campus.

At Grace to You's Truth Matters conference in May, John preached a sermon titled, **"Living in a Perverse World."**

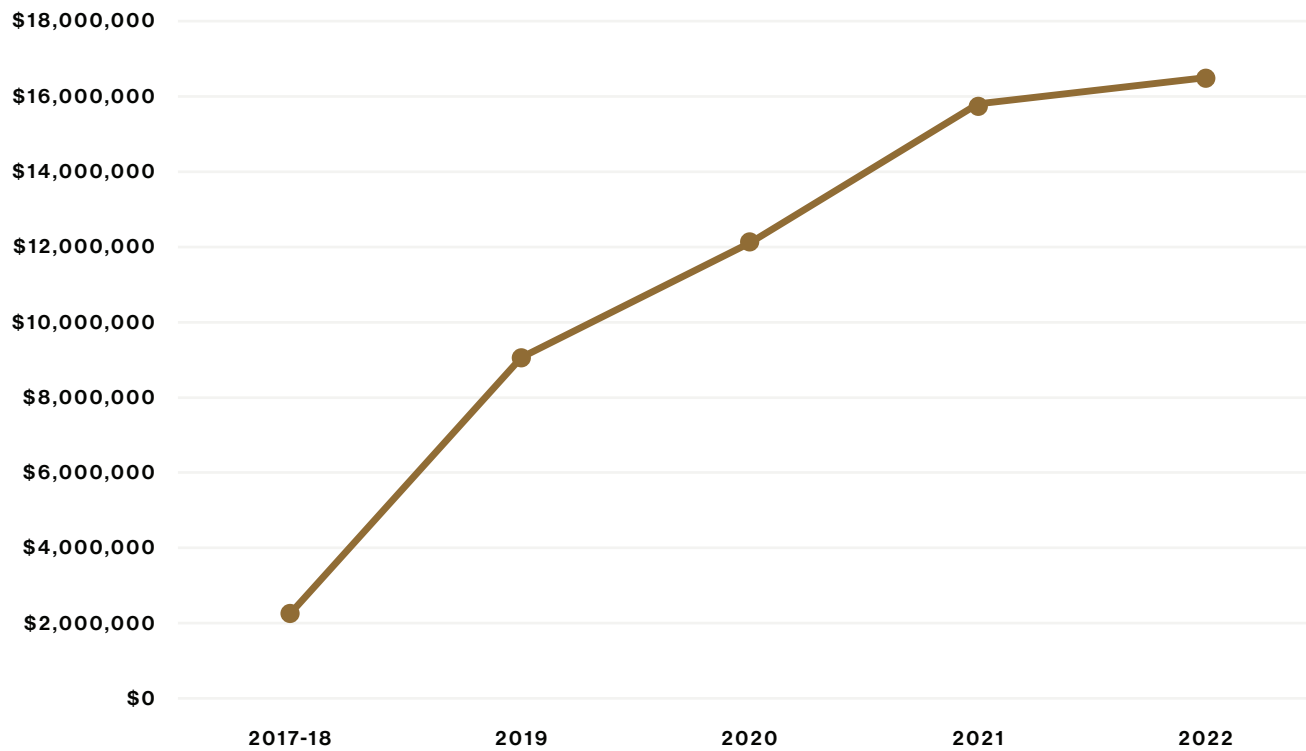
After John published an open letter to California Governor Gavin Newsom, he preached a sermon at Grace Church titled, **"A Plea to a Governor Who Mocks God."**

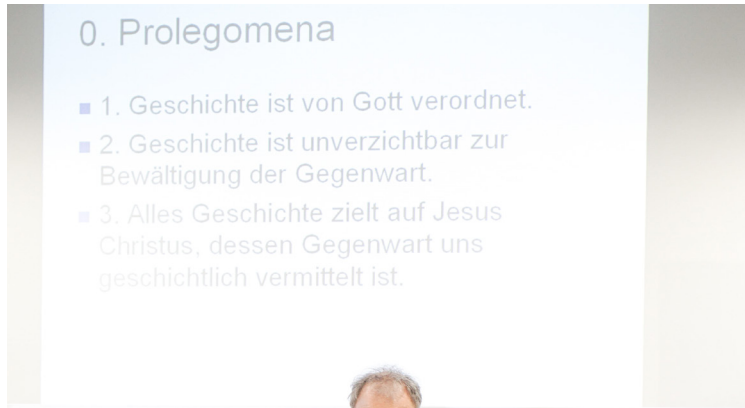
